### “THE SILVER SPOON PRINCE” - BOURGOGNE ROUGE

Pinot Noir is like a silver spoon child; it is hard to grow in the vineyard and even more difficult in the cellar. Sensitive and very stubborn; a real hand full. But if done correctly, it has achieves god-like status, like a prince crowned to king. The best examples are ethereal, dramatically complex and beguiling, most of whom are meticulously handcrafted in de Côtes-de-Nuits in Burgundy. Like the Cistercian monks already knew more than a thousand years ago; we also think of Pinot Noir as the noblest of noble and have selected a couple of great examples.
